



### **Freedom Act 2025**

- \$3500 monthly Basic Income per citizen under a \$42,000 yearly income
- Basic Income is based on the previous or projected 12 months
- Basic Income for under age 16 is paid to legal guardians
- Basic Income online registration only (based on national insurance number)
- Basic Income is non-refundable and non-taxable
- \$25 an hour minimum wage (including gig work)
- 20% consolidated flat tax over \$12,000 a year (with double taxation)
- 20% corporate tax on profits
- 20% value added tax on each stage of sale (paid quarterly)
- 20% value added tax for zero and reduced rates
- 20% value added tax on imports
- VAT registration over \$12,000 a year
- Sole trader registration over \$12,000 a year
- All other taxes, tax credits, duties, tariffs are abolished (all income taxed only)
- 32-hour and 4-day working week entitlement
- 6 weeks per calendar year paid holiday
- Zero-hour contracts are outlawed
- Open border immigration is legalised
- Naturalisation fees are abolished
- Member of Parliament eligibility is lowered to age 16
- Voter eligibility is lowered to age 16
- Prisoner voter eligibility
- Automatic voter registration
- General election online voting
- The House of Lords is abolished
- Full house majority votes to pass legislation in the House of Commons
- Prime minister veto requiring 2/3 votes of parliament
- \$10 billion a year sovereign grant
- Unpaid transaction fees and unarranged overdraft fees are outlawed

- \$5 million per EFG personal grant (\$100+ billion yearly funds for citizens or foreigners)
- All EFG personal grant applicants are accepted in principle and chosen by preference
- 100% government backed EFG unsecured personal loans
- 50 years maximum loan term for EFG unsecured personal loans
- \$500 million maximum loan for EFG unsecured personal loans
- \$500 million maximum net worth and yearly turnover for EFG unsecured personal loans
- The Vagrancy Act 1824 is repealed
- Physical punishment of children is outlawed
- Jury service to be optional
- Open voter registers are abolished
- General classification for legalised films and games
- Free meals for public schools
- VAT exemption for private schools
- The UK census is abolished
- 20% mechanical royalty rate to songwriters for first hand music sales (MCPS)
- 10% mechanical royalty rate of net revenue to songwriters for interactive streaming (MCPS)
- 10% performance royalty rate of net revenue to songwriters for interactive streaming (PRS)
- Maximum 50% recording/publishing royalty split to record labels and publishers
- Existing recording/publishing contracts are renegotiated to at least 50/50 equalling the artists
- Maximum 20% of commission to digital music stores
- Mandatory 80% of net revenue to artists and streaming partners for streaming services
- Mandatory artist/fan centric model for streaming services
- Mandatory creator/artist/label/songwriter 30/30/20/20 split of micro sync royalties for shared music
- Non-binary gender passports
- Unisex public spaces are legalised
- Gender-affirming surgery is lowered to age 16
- Transgender self-identification is legalised at age 16 (parental consent under age 16)
- Conversion therapy is outlawed
- Combustible cladding on buildings is outlawed
- Free combustible cladding removal on request
- 100% British produced renewable electricity (equivalent consumption)
- Free domestic solar panel installation on request
- Free domestic solar panel repair/upgrade on request
- Free domestic loft and wall insulation on request
- Free domestic triple glazing on request
- Hydraulic fracturing processes are outlawed
- Sale of new petrol/diesel vehicles are outlawed (new PHEV/EREV exceptions)
- UK non-organic farming is outlawed
- UK farming GMO exception list (including golden rice)
- UK manufactured non-organic cigarettes, vape liquid, rolling papers, filters are outlawed
- UK manufactured non-faux fabric is outlawed
- UK manufactured non-natural origin cosmetics are outlawed
- Unlimited funding for 100% luxury prisons
- Hunting of wild animals is outlawed
- Trophy hunting imports are outlawed
- Jump horse racing is outlawed
- 2-year-old horse racing is outlawed
- Whips for horse racing are outlawed
- Euthanasia is legalised at age 16 (with repeated consent before the moment of death)

- Euthanasia to be administered by a high court judge and 4 doctors
- Euthanasia drug recommended dose to be 20 grams of sodium pentobarbital intravenously
- All fireworks to require pyrotechnician licencing
- Sale of non-blunt tip kitchen knives are outlawed
- Neck restraint use by police is outlawed
- Pepper spray and tear gas use by police are outlawed
- Police use of batons, stun batons, stun guns, electroshock guns are outlawed
- 5-round firearm magazine limit
- 0.50-inch calibre BMG rifles outlawed
- Silencers for firearms are outlawed
- Licencing/owning/buying/hiring/supervising of guns/airguns/ammunition adjusted to age 18
- Borrowing a rifle or shotgun with supervision adjusted to age 16
- Possession of an airgun unsupervised to remain at age 14
- Airguns to require licencing over 1 ft/lb of muzzle energy (airgun licence)
- The Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 is repealed
- The Psychoactive Substances Act 2016 is repealed
- The Audiovisual Media Services Regulations 2014 is repealed
- Sections 16 to 29 of the Sexual Offences Act 2003 is repealed
- Kerb crawling is decriminalised
- Public sexual activity is decriminalised
- Abortion at all stages of pregnancy is legalised
- Sex work and open licenced brothels are legalised
- STD blood test within the previous two calendar months with negative results for sex workers
- Sex workers are required to record their latest blood test for proof by text or email
- Sex workers and brothels can be fined \$100 for repeated offences and face closure
- Gay and transgender panic defence are abolished
- Incestuous sexual activity is decriminalised at age 16 (based on Rhode Island, US legislation)
- Sex work and pornography are lowered to age 16
- Marriage is lowered to age 16
- Polygamy marriage is legalised at age 16
- Teacher and student sexual activity is lowered to age 16
- Commercial gambling is lowered to age 16
- Sale of alcohol, tobacco and vapes are lowered to age 16
- Sale of recreational drugs are legalised at age 16
- Non-medical use class A drugs are prohibited in the same building unit as children under age 16
- Medical use class A drug list (including morphine/MDMA/psilocybin)
- Recreational drug use in public is decriminalised
- Cannabis grower licencing (with potency regulation)
- Cannabis manufacturer licencing (with potency regulation)
- Cannabis retail open licencing
- 10 mg per serving and 100 mg per package retail limit for THC edibles
- Manufacturing and selling synthetic cannabis are outlawed
- Recreational drug pharmacy licencing (with potency regulation)
- Recreational drug retail licencing (with consumption rooms for selected drugs)
- Car and light motorcycle learner/full licences are raised to age 18 (excluding mobility cars)
- Car and light motorcycle instructor ages are adjusted to 20 with 2-year experience
- Television licence fee is abolished
- A-Level and GCSE hybrid tests to be taken at age 17 and called the School Assessment Test (SAT)
- Secondary school to begin at age 10 and to end at age 17, and university to begin at age 17

- Choice of secondary school classes
- 8 SAT subject minimum in secondary schools
- SAT Mathematics to be a compulsory secondary school subject
- SAT Science, SAT Biology, SAT Chemistry, SAT Physics subject availability (in unison)
- SAT Subject Tests with 25 multiple choice questions to last 3 hours
- SAT Subject Test grading: A\* = 90%, A = 80%, B = 70%, C = 60%, D = 50%, E = 40%, F = <40%
- Great Britain adopts the US English spelling and grammar
- Primary and secondary school to be optional
- Free tuition fees for university and college students
- Debt forgiveness of university and college loans
- British NHS Commissioning Board for commissioning private contracts
- Any free private surgeries on the National Health Service
- Any free private dental surgeries on the National Health Service
- Any free private cosmetic surgeries on the National Health Service
- Any free prescription fees on the National Health Service
- Any free disability equipment and home adaptations on the National Health Service
- Any free private residential and nursing homes on the National Health Service
- Single 2-day weigh-ins and no rehydration clauses for professional combat sport events
- 10 round maximum for professional boxing events
- 14 oz gloves for pro boxing and elite amateur boxing, 7 oz gloves for MMA (excluding bareknuckle)
- 20 oz gloves and face saver headgear for unpaid boxing events (excluding bareknuckle)
- Great Britain local elections to be held in the midterm every 4 years
- Local election reform with 1 councillor or mayor per county or city or borough or town or village
- Local election reform to retain the London Assembly
- Arms sales to Israel banned until 1/1/2050
- Purchasing of all foreign UK prisoners for \$1 billion per country
- Great Britain to rejoin the EU
- Great Britain to join the Schengen Area
- Initiate the Eurasian Union with the European Union, Australia, New Zealand, Ukraine
- Initiate the European Court and EU Court to merge into the Eurasian Court in Strasbourg
- Initiate the Eurasian Union and the Council of Europe to share the Eurasian Court in Strasbourg
- Initiate a quad yearly 2028 Eurasian Parliament election
- Initiate Eurasian Parliament and national dual mandates
- Scottish and Welsh parliamentary law are abolished for a British unitary state law
- Snap elections are abolished for 4-year fixed term general elections beginning in 2028
- Great Britain general elections to be decided by the popular vote and first-past-the-post voting
- Parliamentary coalition greater than 50% votes overrides the highest overall party percentage
- 500 seat maximum for the House of Commons
- Unlimited donations to political parties from citizens or foreigners without declaration
- Unlimited spending for political parties in Great Britain general election
- Great Britain to sign the United Nations Mercenary Convention
- Great Britain grants independence to United Ireland
- Dissolution of the Commonwealth Realms and the Commonwealth of Nations
- \$250 billion a year budget for the British Armed Forces
- \$20 billion for the men's British Super League, Premier League, Football League per season
- \$6 billion for the women's British Super League, Premier League per season
- England/Scotland/Wales sport teams to merge into Great Britain sport teams
- Initiate a FIFA/UEFA merger with a biennial World Cup and FIFA Eurasian Champions League
- Initiate an Olympic/Commonwealth Games merger into the biennial World Games

- World Billions Lotto with 75 numbers and only 3 number jackpots at \$5/€5 per line
- World Billions Lotto website to be at [worldbillions.lotto](http://worldbillions.lotto) and drawn on Thursdays only
- World Billions Lotto to be debit card only and jackpot winnings paid instantly to bank accounts
- Initiate the World dollar and euro to have a fixed exchange rate to the US dollar
- The World dollar to replace the British pound as the currency of Great Britain
- The World dollar currency available to the World Federation
- The World Federation consisting of the Eurasian Union, Panamerican Union, African Union
- The World Federation website to be at [worldfederation.int](http://worldfederation.int)
- The World Federation flag to have a metallic gold background and a centred white meridian globe
- Gold colour World \$100 note with a King Charles III portrait
- Silver colour World \$50 note with a Nelson Mandela portrait
- Bronze colour World \$20 note with a Malcolm X portrait
- Orange colour World \$10 note with a Martin Luther King Jr portrait
- Green colour World \$5 note with a Barack Obama portrait
- Blue colour World \$2 note with a Meghan, Duchess of Sussex portrait
- All gold colour World \$1 coin based on the British £1 coin
- All gold colour World 50c coin based on the British 50p coin
- All gold colour World 20c coin based on the British 20p coin
- All gold colour World 10c coin based on the British 10p coin
- All gold colour World 5c coin based on the British 5p coin
- Physical transactions rounded up by 5c
