



Freedom Act 2025

- \$3500 monthly Basic Income per citizen under a \$42,000 yearly income
- Basic Income is based on the previous or projected 12 months
- Basic Income for under age 16 is paid to legal guardians
- Basic Income online registration only (based on social security number)
- Basic Income is non-refundable and non-taxable
- \$25 an hour minimum wage (including gig work)
- 20% consolidated flat tax over \$12,000 a year (with double taxation)
- 20% corporate tax on profits
- 20% value added tax on each stage of sale (paid quarterly)
- 20% value added tax on imports
- VAT registration over \$12,000 a year
- Sole trader registration over \$12,000 a year
- All other taxes, tax credits, duties, tariffs are abolished (all income taxed only)
- 32-hour and 4-day working week entitlement
- 6 weeks per calendar year paid holiday
- Zero-hour contracts are outlawed
- Open border immigration is legalized
- Naturalization fees are abolished
- President of the US eligibility is lowered to age 16
- Member of Congress eligibility is lowered to age 16
- Voter eligibility is lowered to age 16
- Prisoner voter eligibility
- Automatic voter registration
- Presidential election online voting (executive and legislative dual roles are legalized)
- US midterm elections are abolished
- The US Senate is abolished
- Full house majority votes to pass legislation in the House of Representatives
- Washington DC law replaces state law (US Congress replaces DC and state governments)
- Unpaid transaction fees and unarranged overdraft fees are outlawed

- \$5 million per SBA personal grant (\$100+ billion yearly funds for citizens or foreigners)
- All SBA personal grant applicants are accepted in principle and chosen by preference
- 100% government backed SBA unsecured personal loans
- 50 years maximum loan term for SBA unsecured personal loans
- \$500 million maximum loan for SBA unsecured personal loans
- \$500 million maximum net worth and yearly turnover for SBA unsecured personal loans
- Tax free gambling winnings
- Wages for NCAA athletes
- The Mann Act is repealed
- Physical punishment of children is outlawed
- Jury service to be optional
- Free meals for public schools
- General classification for legalized films and games
- The US census is abolished
- 20% mechanical royalty rate to songwriters for first hand music sales (CRB)
- 10% mechanical royalty rate of net revenue to songwriters for interactive streaming (CRB)
- 10% performance royalty rate of net revenue to songwriters for interactive streaming (CRB)
- Maximum 50% recording/publishing royalty split to record labels and music publishers
- Existing recording/publishing contracts are renegotiated to at least 50/50 equalling the artists
- Maximum 20% of commission to digital music stores
- Mandatory 80% of net revenue to artists and streaming partners for streaming services
- Mandatory artist/fan centric model for streaming services
- Mandatory creator/artist/label/songwriter 30/30/20/20 split of micro sync royalties for shared music
- Gender-affirming surgery is lowered to age 16
- Transgender self-identification is lowered to age 16 (parental consent under age 16)
- Combustible cladding on buildings is outlawed
- Free combustible cladding removal on request
- 100% American produced renewable electricity (equivalent consumption)
- Free domestic solar panel installation on request
- Free domestic solar panel repair/upgrade on request
- Free domestic loft and wall insulation on request
- Free domestic triple glazing on request
- Hydraulic fracturing processes are outlawed
- Sale of new petrol/diesel vehicles are outlawed (new PHEV/EREV exceptions)
- US non-organic farming is outlawed
- US farming GMO exception list (including golden rice)
- US manufactured non-organic cigarettes, vape liquid, rolling papers, filters are outlawed
- US manufactured non-faux fabric is outlawed
- US manufactured non-natural origin cosmetics are outlawed
- Cosmetic ingredients tested on animals are outlawed
- Selling asbestos products are outlawed
- Unlimited funding for 100% luxury prisons
- Muzzles for American Pit Bull Terriers, Rottweilers, Presa Canarios in public
- Muzzles for American Bullies, Dogos Argentinos, Fila Brasileiros, Japanese Tosas in public
- Muzzles for American Bulldogs, American Staffordshire Terriers, Staffordshire Bull Terriers in public
- Trophy hunting imports are outlawed
- Jump horse racing is outlawed
- 2-year-old horse racing is outlawed
- Whips for horse racing are outlawed

- Organ donations opt-out policy
- Euthanasia is legalized at age 16 (with repeated consent before the moment of death)
- Euthanasia to be administered by a district judge and 4 doctors
- Euthanasia drug recommended dose to be 20 grams of sodium pentobarbital intravenously
- Capital punishment is abolished
- All fireworks to require pyrotechnician licensing
- Sale of non-blunt top kitchen knives are outlawed
- Pepper spray and tear gas use by the police and public are outlawed
- Batons, stun batons, stun guns, electroshock guns are outlawed
- Police use of batons, stun batons, guns, stun guns, electroshock guns are outlawed
- Automatic guns, burst fire guns, handguns are outlawed
- Semi-automatic centerfire rifles are outlawed
- Pump action centerfire rifles are outlawed
- MARS rifles and lever release rifles are outlawed
- 5-round firearm magazine limit
- Self defense using guns are outlawed
- Long guns to require licensing (long gun license)
- Prohibited weapons to require licensing (prohibited weapon license)
- Unlimited guns for special police
- Licensing/owning/buying/hiring/supervising of guns/airguns/ammunition legalized at age 18
- Borrowing a rifle or shotgun with supervision legalized at age 16
- Possession of an airgun unsupervised legalized at age 14
- 5-year license renewal for sporting guns
- Semi-automatic rifles maximum caliber 0.22 inches
- Shotgun maximum 3 shells including chamber
- 12 ft/lb air rifle muzzle energy limit
- 6 ft/lb air pistol muzzle energy limit
- 2 ft/lb semi-automatic airsoft gun muzzle energy limit
- 1 ft/lb automatic airsoft gun muzzle energy limit
- Airguns over 1 ft/lb of muzzle energy to require licensing (airgun license)
- Airguns with self-contained gas cartridges are outlawed
- Prohibition of female genital mutilation with up to a \$50,000 fine and maximum 6-month jail sentence
- Curb crawling is decriminalized
- Public sexual activity is decriminalized
- Sex work and open licensed brothels are legalized
- STD blood test within the previous two calendar months with negative results for sex workers
- Sex workers are required to record their latest blood test for proof by text or email
- Sex workers and brothels can be fined \$100 for repeated offenses and face closure
- Incestuous sexual activity is decriminalized at age 16 (based on Rhode Island, US legislation)
- Sex work and pornography are lowered to age 16
- Marriage is lowered to age 16
- Polygamy marriage is legalized at age 16
- Teacher and student sexual activity is lowered to age 16
- Commercial gambling is legalized at age 16
- Sale of alcohol, tobacco and vapes are lowered to age 16
- Sale of recreational drugs are legalized at age 16
- Non-medical use class A drugs are prohibited in the same building unit as children under age 16
- Medical use class A drug list (including morphine/MDMA/psilocybin)
- Drinking alcohol and recreational drug use in public are decriminalized

- Cannabis grower licensing (with potency regulation)
- Cannabis manufacturer licensing (with potency regulation)
- Cannabis retail open licensing
- Manufacturing and selling synthetic cannabis are outlawed
- Recreational drug pharmacy licensing (with potency regulation)
- Recreational drug retail licensing (with consumption rooms for selected drugs)
- Car and light motorcycle learner/full licenses are raised to age 18 (excluding mobility cars)
- Car and light motorcycle instructor ages are adjusted to 20 with 2-year experience
- SAT Subject Tests to replace the high school diploma, SAT test, AP exams
- SAT Subject Tests to match OCR UK subjects
- High school to begin at age 10 and to end at age 17, and university to begin at age 17
- Choice of high school classes
- 8 SAT subject minimum in high schools
- SAT Mathematics to be a compulsory high school subject
- SAT Science, SAT Biology, SAT Chemistry, SAT Physics subject availability (in unison)
- SAT Subject Tests with 25 multiple choice questions to last 3 hours
- SAT Subject Test grading: A* = 90%, A = 80%, B = 70%, C = 60%, D = 50%, E = 40%, F = <40%
- Elementary and high school to be optional
- Free tuition fees for university and college students
- Debt forgiveness of university and college loans
- Foundation of the National Health Service (NHS)
- NHS Commissioning Board for commissioning private contracts
- Debt forgiveness of medical bills
- Any free private surgeries on the National Health Service
- Any free private dental surgeries on the National Health Service
- Any free private cosmetic surgeries on the National Health Service
- Any free prescription fees on the National Health Service
- Any free disability equipment and home adaptations on the National Health Service
- Any free private residential and nursing homes on the National Health Service
- Single 2-day weigh-ins and no rehydration clauses for professional combat sport events
- 10 round maximum for professional boxing events
- 14 oz gloves for pro boxing and elite amateur boxing, 7 oz gloves for MMA (excluding bareknuckle)
- 20 oz gloves and face saver headgear for unpaid boxing events (excluding bareknuckle)
- US local elections to be held in the midterm every 4 years
- Local election reform with 1 councillor or mayor per county or city or borough or town or village
- Purchasing of all foreign US prisoners for \$1 billion per country
- Federal pardons for Edward Snowden, Julian Assange, Chelsea Manning, Reality Winner
- \$500 billion a year to Ukraine over 2 years (with unlimited weapon and transport usage)
- \$250 billion to the Palestine Liberation Organization for UBI
- \$100 billion to the NUG of Myanmar
- Arms sales to Israel banned until 1/1/2050
- Presidential and congressional elections to be merged
- Presidential elections to be decided by the popular vote and first-past-the-post voting
- Congressional coalition greater than 50% votes overrides the highest overall party percentage
- The House of Representatives increases its membership to 500 seats
- 50 senior senators given seats in the House of Representatives
- Alaska/Delaware/Hawaii/Idaho/Maine junior senators given seats in the House of Representatives
- Montana/Nebraska/Vermont/Wyoming junior senators given seats in the House of Representatives
- 6 non-voting members of the House of Representatives to be allocated voting membership

- Signature requirement for ballot access is abolished
- Unlimited donations to political parties from citizens or foreigners without declaration
- Statehood granted to all US territories
- US territories retain national sport team status
- The US to change to the UK date format
- The US to sign the United Nations Arms Trade Treaty
- The US to sign the United Nations Mercenary Convention
- The US dollar available to Panamerican Union members
- Creation of the Panamerican Union (PU)
- Elected Panamerican Parliament group chairperson is appointed President of the Panamerican Union
- Majority quorum for the Panamerican Parliament
- Panamerican Union members to be allocated 1 seat each in the Panamerican Parliament
- Panamerican Union members to issue Panamerican Union passports
- Panamerican Parliament elections to be held every 4 years beginning in 2028
- Panamerican Parliament elections to be decided by the popular vote and first-past-the-post voting
- Panamerican Parliament, Panamerican Council, national triple mandates are permitted
- The Panamerican Union flag to be a red version of the European flag
- The Panamerican Union headquarters to be in Washington DC, US
- The Panamerican Union to establish the Panamerican Union Customs Union
- The Panamerican Union website to be at panamericanunion.gov
- The Panamerican Council to be comprised of the heads of government
- The Panamerican Council to initiate legislation and the Panamerican Parliament to pass legislation
- The President of the Panamerican Union to be appointed the Panamerican Parliament speaker
- The President of the Panamerican Union with veto power requiring 2/3 Panamerican Parliament votes
- The Panamerican Court to be in Washington DC, US
- Organization of American States members are invited into the Panamerican Union
- The 22nd Amendment to the US Constitution is repealed
- World born citizen eligibility for the President and Vice President of the US
- United States of Earth invitation by the year 2050 with \$10 billion annual grants per royal family
- United States of Earth treaty to be called the Global Economic Socialism and Reform Act
- United States of Earth to be governed by the US Constitution, US Code, Code of DC
- United States of Earth to adopt the World dollar currency
- Import VAT to be abolished for the United States of Earth
- 100% United Nations member requirement for the United States of Earth
- Initiate the UN 194th member admission for Palestine
- 200 seats for the USE (194 UN nations, Puerto Rico, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Tibet, Kashmir, Kurdistan)
- South/North Korea to have 1 seat combined, Sudan and South Sudan to have 1 seat combined
- Greenland to have 1 seat, Chechnya to have 1 seat
- The USE flag to be identical to the World Federation flag
- USE members to be allocated 1 seat each in the House of Nations (US Capitol)
- USE members to at least have US English as their second official language

Estimated Revenue: \$18 trillion a year (\$1 trillion a year surplus)
